### Notes to Financial Statements

### ACCOUNTS

The Muslim Students' Association (MSA) at York University is a non-profit organization that caters to the needs of Muslims on campus. It provides students with prayer space, encourages and promotes the practice of Islam and holds lectures and social events to benefit the community at York University. The Muslim Students' Association's main source of funding is through the donation received from the student body. The funding is then distributed through three major accounts: MSA operations, Sadaqah and Ramadan Iftar Program.

MSA Operations is used to make any necessary purchases to run a smooth and organized club. It can be used for events and activities such as dinners, lectures, Islam Awareness Week, etc. or it can be used to purchase a bookshelf or office supplies. MSA Operation funds are collected through Jumu'ah donations.

Sadaqah is used to help out struggling families and individuals in our local community and sometimes internationally. Sometimes, the account gets dedicated to certain fundraisers or charities such as Islamic Relief. Sadaqah funds are collected through Jumu'ah donations and the Paypal account linked to the York MSA website.

Ramadan Iftar Program is only open during the month of Ramadan. The purpose of this account is to provide free iftars to those living on campus. RIP funds are collected a few weeks before the start of Ramadan, after Jumu'ah prayers, and then during iftars. Sometimes, full days are sponsored by other clubs at York University such as York Federation of Students, Pakistan Student Association, and Islamic Relief.

#### REVENUE

**Memberships:** Although the York MSA is a non-profit organization, we encourage students to purchase a membership. It costs only \$10.00 for the school year. Members get discounts on MSA ticketed events and also at various restaurants that the York MSA has collaborated with. With the purchase of a membership, students also have access to sign out books from the amazing Islamic library.

**YFS Base Funding:** The YFS (York Federation of Students) is the student union which provides its ratified clubs with \$200.00 of base funding.

**YFS Event Funding:** The YFS provides its ratified clubs with monetary compensation for up to \$800.00 for each event that the club chooses to hold. Over the course of the year, the MSA has hosted numerous events, such as dinners, bake sales, lectures, Islam Awareness Weeks, and much more. We have received funding for the following events: Welcome BBQ, Sisters' Laser Tag Trip, Sisters' Meet & Greet, Fall Dawah Training, Marriage Workshops, Fall Islam Awareness Week, Charity Week, Fall Dinner, Sisters' Sports Day, Bukhari 101 lecture, Brothers' Archery Tag Trip, Eid Brunch, Ramadan Iftar Program Days, Converts Panel, Winter Islam Awareness Week, Winter Dawah Training, Academic Panel, Bukhari 102, Sisters Dinner, Ilmster Course, and YorkU Qirat-ul-Quran Competition.

**Jumu'ah (Friday) Donations:** Although the York MSA does not ask for donations, a donation box is presented every Friday after salah (prayer) for anyone who wishes to donate to the MSA.

**Paypal Donations:** A paypal account is linked to the MSA website however, it only has the option to donate for Sadaqah.

**MSA Events:** Although, most of our events have resulted in a loss, we have gotten a profit from the Snow Valley Ski Trip.

#### **EXPENSES**

Throughout the year of 2016 – 2017, the MSA hosted twenty-four events ranging from social dinners to knowledgeable lectures. Some of our major events that occurred this year are listed below.

**Ramadan Iftar Program (RIP)**: Since this program is the largest event the MSA hosts, it has a separate account dedicated to it. The account opens a few weeks before Ramadan to collect donations to support the program and then closes once Ramadan finishes. It serves approximately 150 – 200 students daily with free iftars. Some iftars are sponsored through clubs or individuals, others donate dates, water bottles, desserts, etc. The breakdown of the account is as follows:

**Sisters' Meet & Greet:** An annual get together for sisters to meet each other and get to know the new team. As a free event, there was a net loss of \$221.75. However, with YFS funding, it was reduced to \$121.75.

**Welcome BBQ:** The York MSA hosted a BBQ after Jumu'ah with hotdogs and hamburgers. We received more than expected number of attendees. As a free event, it incurred a loss of \$885 which was later covered by a full post-event funding from YFS of \$800. However, there is still a net loss of \$85.

**Brothers' Archery Tag Trip:** The brothers had a chance to go for Archery Tag as their annual trip. Transportation was not arranged by MSA. Ticket sales equaled to \$235 and YFS funding was received of \$75. Expenses equal to revenue and there is no loss or profit.

**Fall Dinner**: This was the annual formal dinner dedicated to the new and recurring members of MSA to establish a warm welcome to the York community. The dinner consisted of entertainment, jeopardy, food and a short lecture by Sheikh Ibrahim Hindy. The food was catered by Xawaash, a Somali restaurant. There were approximately 140 – 150 attendees. The expenses equaled to \$1423.75. However, with the ticket sales of \$1,005 and YFS funding of \$112.66, there was only a net loss of \$306.09.

**Charity Week:** A week annually dedicated to collecting funds for the Charity Week for Ophans and Needy Children organization. There were many events planned throughout the week, from a bake sale to an online auction. Expenses equaled to \$659.97, all taken from MSA Operations. Donations collected equaled to \$1231.45 and were transferred to Charity Week. YFS Funding was received for \$100, leading the net loss to equal \$559.97.

**Sisters' Sports Day:** This was the 2<sup>nd</sup> annual sports day hosted by the MSA for sisters in Tait Mckenzie. There were a total of 32 attendees. Expenses equaled to a total of \$1,771.80. We earned \$340 through ticket sales and \$400 from YFS funding, which made the net loss to \$1,031.80.

**Islaw Awareness Week (Fall):** A week dedicated to spreading awareness and knowledge of Islam. The theme for this semester was "The Heart" with educational lectures and events planned. We had approximately 155 attendees throughout the week. Expenses equaled to \$1155.55 with no revenue except YFS funding of \$300. There was a net loss of \$695.55.

**Qirat-ul-Quran Competition:** An annual event that allows young Muslim students the experience to collectively celebrate the divine word of God through the recitation of the Quran. This year's challenge was to recite Surah An-Nur. There were only spots for ten sister and ten brother competitors at York MSA. The winners were then qualified to enter the interuniversity competition hosted by McMasters MSA. Expenses equaled to \$165.85 with no revenue. YFS funding was received for \$150. Net loss equals to \$15.85.

**Chai & Chat – Sisters' Dinner:** This is the annual sister's dinner, an evening filled with food, entertainment, prizes, and a variety of chai/teas. Food was catered from Choppan Grill, an Afghan restaurant. There were 60 attendees. The expenses equaled to \$1,043.24, with revenue of \$430 in ticket sales. YFS funding was received for \$400. Net loss equals to \$213.24.

**Snow Valley Ski Trip:** A trip planned during the winter reading week to Snow Valley Ski Resort. Activities included skiing, snowboarding and snow tubing. There were 76 attendees. Transportation was arranged through MSA. Expenses equaled to \$3,596.40 with ticket sales of \$4150. There was a net profit of \$553.60.

**Islam Awareness Week (Winter):** The winter semester theme was "In Search of Truth", relating back to the prophets (peace be upon them) and their search for truth and guidance. There were approximately 120 attendees throughout the events of the week. There was a new dawah wall purchased. Expenses equaled to \$1,473.07 with no revenue. YFS funding was received for \$390. There is a net loss of \$1,083.07.

**A Night of Solace:** A lecture and Qur'an recitation by the renowned Qari Sh. Abu Bakr Al Shatri, from Saudi Arabia. Expenses equaled upto \$97.75 with no revenue. Net loss equals to \$97.75.

**Members' Appreciation Dinner:** The last event of the year where the MSA expresses their gratitude to the MSA members and non-members for their constant support and attendance throughout the year. An evening filled with entertainment, games, a short lecture and Pakistani/Indian cuisine catered from Silver Spoon. There were around 90 attendees. Expenses equaled to a total of \$786.60 with revenue of \$565 from ticket sales. YFS funding has been applied for, but not received yet. As of April 2016, net loss equals to \$221.60.

#### Administrative Expenses:

Website Renewal - The MSA website and email have to be renewed annually through the web hosting service. The expense was of \$95.88.

Bank Charges: Starting September 2016, the BMO business plan changed and now charges \$6/month with benefits of no minimum balance, 2 free interact e-transfer transactions, \$500 withdrawal limit per day, and more. Expense through the year equaled to \$48.

Service Charges: This is the room-set that was provided for the dinners. Expenses equaled to a total of \$455.

Office Supplies: The MSA office required new supplies to run organized events such as utensils and cleaning supplies. The Student Centre Musallah was instilled with an Islamic library bookcase. Expenses equaled to \$861.10.

Club Promotion: The MSA sells new memberships every year to provide members with discounts and access to various resources. This year the cost for a membership was \$10. Club promotion expenses include membership cards and other incentives used to encourage students to buy memberships. Expenses equaled to \$69.45.
